
IEP Goals for the Side-Lyer

Item Name: **Side-Lyer**

Item # 352 and #2310

The Side-Lyer is designed to encourage upper extremity movement as well as position the child. Some of the activities for therapy and teaching new skills are listed below.

Activity:

Level: easy

Ages: 3-10

Diagnoses: Developmentally delayed, cerebral palsy

How to Play: Affix item #2310 “Side-Lyer Activity Center” to the “Side-Lyer Toy”. Place it perpendicular to the child’s positioner. After the child plays with one item on the center, move the “Side-Lyer Toy” several inches towards his feet or head. Change the position several times during the play period to increase movement in different ranges of motion.

Activity Analysis: Skills and Performance Components this toy and activity will address:

- **Cognitive/Language:** Scanning, focus and attention
- **Gross Motor:** Active Range of Motion for upper extremities, praxis (motor planning), visual-motor integration, lateral muscle stretch
- **Fine Motor:** Lateral pincer (pulling the string), finger isolation, (pushing the button)
- **Sensory:** Visual awareness and processing, auditory awareness, perceptual processing for position in space, somatosensory (playing with the bead chains)

Activity IEP Goals: *LTG-Long Term Goal, OBJ- Short Term Objective (*please note this is not an exhaustive list*)

- **Gross Motor:** To improve motor planning to enhance quality of movement and efficient organization of self

for effective participation in school activities (LTG) by demonstrating the improved ability to execute movements such as raising an arm and reaching for a toy above shoulder level with only initial directions (STO)

- **Gross Motor:** To improve active range of motion of bilateral upper extremities (LTG) by increasing shoulder flexion and extension in gravity eliminated position while motivated by auditory and visual toys. (STO)
- **Fine Motor:** To improve functional shoulder, arm and hand control for greater success with fine motor tasks and classroom/home manipulatives (LTG), by demonstrating purposeful and accurate reach toward objects (STG).
